But one day, Solomon came back to find his older boy, Joshua, huddled in a corner, crying inconsolably. Rosenberg's heart sank. "Tell me it's not true!" he said to Joshua. "It's true, Poppa...", he gasped through the sobbing, "they took David away today." "Where's your mother?" Solomon asked. "She went with David, Poppa", he sobbed, "when David started crying and said that he was afraid, Momma said, "Don't be scared David, I will go with you!" She held his hand tightly and went with him.

That, dear friends, is a true picture of motherhood! As much as it is a picture of the love of Father God who sent His Son Jesus, to be with us always, even through the hardest moments of our lives. I pray that today you will appreciate and bless the mothers that have played a role in your life, shaping you with great pain and sacrificial care, into the person you are. Let them know how much they mean to you, bring a big old smile to their lips, a twinkle to their eyes and a warm glow to their loving hearts!


